#### To be done with the help of an Adult

##### INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups | 750g long grain parboiled rice
- Tomato Stew
- Meat /Chicken
- Pepper and salt (to taste)
- 2 medium onions
- 3 Knorr cubes
- 2 teaspoons thyme

##### BEFORE YOU COOK JOLLOF RICE

1. Prepare the tomato stew.
2. If you will use whole chicken then wash and cut it into pieces. Cook with the thyme, Knorr cubes and 2 bulbs of onions (chopped). The cooking time depends on the type of chicken. When done, grill it in an oven or also fry it. This is to give it a golden look which is more presentable especially if you have guests for dinner.
3. Parboil the rice. Rinse the parboiled rice and put in a sieve to drain.

##### COOKING DIRECTIONS

1. Pour the chicken stock and the tomato stew into a sizeable pot and leave to boil.
2. Add the drained parboiled rice, salt and pepper to taste. The water level should be the same level of the rice. This is to ensure that all the water dries up by the time the rice is cooked.
3. Cover the pot and leave to cook on low to medium heat. This way the rice does not burn before the water dries up.  
The rice should be done by the time the water is dry. Taste to confirm. If not, you will need to add more water and reduce the heat to prevent burning. Keep cooking till done.  
Serve with Fried Plantain, Moi Moi, Salad or Coleslaw.

Verily! We have sent it (this Qur'an) down in the night of Al-Qadr (Decree) And what will make you know what the night of Al Qadr (Decree) is? The night of Al Qadr (Decree) is better than a thousand months (I.e. 83 years and 4 months). Therein Descend the angels and the Ruh (Jibreal (Gabriel)) by Allah's permission with all Decrees, Peace! (All that night, there is Peace and Goodness from Allah to His believing slaves) until the appearance of dawn.

**Only Allah knows when the Night of Qadr is. But the Messenger of Allah ﷺ has told us to seek for it during the odd nights on the last 10 nights of Ramadan.**

Ask your parents/teachers to read more about Laylatul Qadr to you and seek for the night of Laylatul Qadr this Ramadan. Remember to say this dua:

**O Allaah! You are forgiving, and you love forgiveness. So forgive me”**

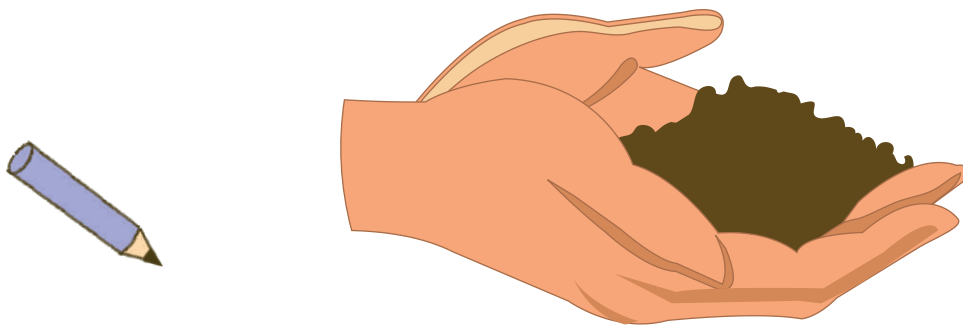
# Zakaatul Fitr

Zakaatul Fitr is a form of charity that every Muslim who is able to, must give to the poor and needy at the end of Ramadan and before Eid Salaah.

Allah's Messenger ﷺ enjoined the payment of one Saa' of dates or one Saa' of barley as Zakat-ul-fitr on every Muslim slave or free, male or female, young or old, and he ordered that it be paid before the people went out to offer the Eid prayer.  
(Saheeh Al Bukhaari Hadeeth Number 1418)

- 4 Eat a date before going to the Praying ground.
- 5 Say the Takbeer loudly on the way to the Eid prayer till the Imam starts the Eid prayer.
- 6 Use different routes or paths when returning home from the Praying ground.
